Guidelines for Citizen Participation

The Town Council welcomes you to the meetings, and believes it is important to hear from local citizens regarding issues that concern you and your neighbors. For the benefit of all, we kindly request that you adhere to the following guidelines for participation during the meetings:

- People desiring to speak to Council should notify the clerk prior to the beginning of the meeting. Please sign in and give your phone number or address so that we may follow up with you on any issues raised at the meeting.
- People may comment only on the following:
 - Items on the current meeting agenda
 - Items under consideration from previous council meetings
- Individuals desiring to comment on topics not mentioned above may do so by submitting a written request to the Town Clerk and to be scheduled as a specific agenda item at a future meeting.
- We ask that you adhere to the following rules of decorum when addressing Council:
 - Be recognized by the presiding officer before speaking.
 - State your name, physical address, and whether you live within town limits.
 - Speak from the podium in a civil, non-argumentative, and respectful manner.
 - Whenever a group wishes to address Council on the same subject, the presiding officer may request that a spokesperson be selected to speak on the group's behalf.
 - All remarks should be directed to the Council as a body rather than at a particular Councilmember, any member of the staff, or any other member of the audience.
 - Speakers are to refrain from using: profanity, language that is disruptive to incite violence or outbursts from the audience; language that is disruptive to the orderly process of the meeting; making any personal attacks toward Councilmembers or employees; yelling or shouting.
- Comments made during the public comment period of the meeting will be taken as information by Council. The Council and/or staff may follow up with you as need to address your issues or concerns in a timely manner.
- Anyone violating the guidelines and disrupting the meeting may be asked to leave and, if necessary, removed from the meeting.

This memo is to inform you that the month of **April is Fair Housing Month**. As recipients of federal funding through the HUD HOME Consortium Program, every member is **required to perform a Fair Housing action during the month of April**.

Lower Savannah COG is here to assist you with any questions you may have about Fair Housing. The activity list includes a Fair Housing information center in a centralized area to distribute fair housing materials to the general public. There is a HUD website (HUD.GOV/Fair Housing) Outreach Tools for brochures and other information to hand out to the public. Remember we will need documentation of your activities for you to continue receiving funds through the HUD HOME Consortium Program.

Below includes (but is not limited to) some ideas for Fair Housing activities

- Proclaim each April as Fair Housing Month at a council meeting and notify the public of this action.
- Display fair housing posters in Town Hall or the County Administrative building and other prominent buildings.
- Create a fair housing information center in a centralized area to distribute fair housing materials to the general public.
- Establish a special resource file on affirmatively furthering fair housing and include:
 - Copies of local fair housing laws/ordinances,
 - Copies of the State Fair Housing Law,
 - Copies of HUD's Advertising Guidelines,

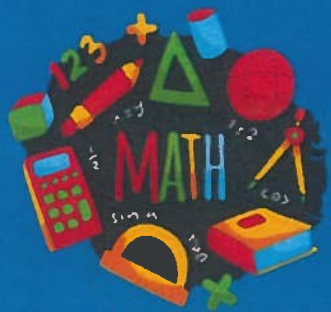
